WOMEN'S ANTI-APARTHEID PROTEST

Dear Friend,

A mass protest at Seattle's South African Consulate is being called for Sunday, March 10, 1985 in commemoration of Harriet Tubman's death and in honor of International Women's Day. The first planning meeting will be Tuesday, February 19 at 7:00 pm at the Central Area Motivation Program (CAMP), 722 18th Avenue. You are invited to attend and help organize this action which we hope will reflect the broad range of Seattle's women's movements. Please bring your friends, ideas and energy.

The demonstration, open to all those committed to stopping apartheid and US racism, will be part of the ongoing protests against the presence of the South African Consulate in this state. We hope to stage a large rally which will send a message our public officials cannot ignore: close the Consulate; divest all US money from South Africa; stop the prosecution of anti-apartheid demonstrators and work to end poverty, racism and all forms of discrimination.

March 10th marks the 54th anniversary of Harriet Tubman's death. Tubman was a militant leader of the abolitionist movement and was respected as a bold conductor in the underground railroad. Friday, March 8th is International Women's Day -- a day set aside to highlight the struggles of women for Freedom from poverty, discrimination and inequality. We think that protesting apartheid at Seattle's South African Consulate is the best way to honor today's activists who, like Tubman, are leading the fight for justice and equality the world over.

The planning meeting is being called by Maryamu Eltayeb of the Seattle Coalition Against Apartheid, Muffy Sunde of Radical Women and others active in the fight against apartheid and racism in Seattle.
