This shanty has been erected to represent the poverty and inhumanity of South African Apartheid, a system which denies the most basic human and political rights to 23 million Black Africans who live there - simply because of the color of their skin. Because Blacks in S. Africa cannot legally own houses in "white areas", areas which constitute 87% of the land, they are forced to live in makeshift shacks such as this one in order to be close to relatives who are "legally" working in the cities.

This shanty will be staffed 24 hours a day for the next two weeks, March 20 to April 4th to publicize the upcoming weeks of action against racism and Apartheid. We also want to publicize some tangible ways in which the Univ. of Michigan can help to oppose Apartheid
