Dear Anti-Apartheid Organizer:

All is going well with the plans for what promises to be a tremendous rally. We look forward to seeing you.

Here is a schedule of bus drop-off sites and bus parking sites.

I. BUS DROP OFF SITES

A. Dag Hammarskjold Plaza on 2nd. and 3rd Avenues between 45th. and 50th Street. (labeled "D" on map)

Marchers from areas outside of New York should assemble on 49th St. between 1st and 2nd Avenues.

B. Harlem Site

Those wishing to march from the Harlem site should be dropped off at Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. State Office Building at 125th Street and Adam Clayton Powell Boulevard (7th Ave.) (Labeled "A" on map)

C. New Jersey

Those coming from New Jersey can be dropped at 42nd Street between 10th and 11th Avenue.

II. BUS PARKING

Bus parking is on Central Park West on both sides of street (labeled "B" on map)

Rally 1:00 p.m. in Central Park


