Ann Arbor--The case for withdrawing State of Michigan monies from South Africa will be presented Sunday, May 16, by Andrew Mkize of South Africa and Ann Arbor State Representative Perry Bullard.

Mkize is a representative of the African National Congress, the leading opponent of the South African government's white-supremacist policy of apartheid. He is touring the United States to raise funds for the Solomon Mahlangu Freedom College in Tanzania. The college is under construction in Tanzania and will serve exiled South Africans and other foes of apartheid.

Mkize will describe the political and military situation within South Africa. Bullard, who has sponsored a bill to prohibit Michigan educational institutions from investing in corporations operating in South Africa, will discuss ways the state economy could benefit if investments were withdrawn from South Africa.

The fund-raising affair will begin May 16 at 5:30 p.m. with a potluck supper in the U-M Trotter House at 1443 Washtenaw Avenue. The program will begin at 7:30 p.m.

Admission is \$3 for the dinner and program; \$1 for the program only. Proceeds will go to the Solomon Mahlangu Freedom College. The public is invited.
