The enclosed new Southern Africa Literature List contains many titles that will be useful in organizing support for the difficult transition in South Africa. I draw your attention particularly to a few sections of the new list:

Videos: The *Stop the Violence* video powerfully documents the police and security force role in instigating much of the violence in South Africa. This video was produced for The Africa Fund's STOP Apartheid's Violence campaign (see separate section of literature list). *Hlanganani: A Short History of COSATU* a documentary on the one million member South African union federation; and *The Tamboville Invasion*, which documents the important role of the civic movement in South Africa.


Posters: The Africa Fund has just produced a three color poster *Apartheid Regime - Hands Off Labor* by San Francisco artist Sarah Hodgson expressing solidarity with South African unions. Also available are posters for the STOP Apartheid's Violence campaign and the "Nelson Mandela is Free But He Can Not Vote" poster.

You can order a series of ten pamphlets on South Africa individually or collectively in a *South Africa Information Packet*. The Africa Fund has also started a new series *Negotiations Watch* to help keep Americans informed on developments in the negotiations to end apartheid and establish democracy. Also now available is a 1992 *Update* to the 1990 edition of the *Unified List of United States Companies Doing Business in South Africa*.

The Africa Fund has recently published *Africa's Drought and International Response* by Carol Thompson which documents how policies imposed on African countries by the U.S. and other donor nations have made it difficult for African countries to respond to the drought that threatens the lives of millions.

VIDEOS

STOP THE VIOLENCE (South Africa Now, 1992) video — 14 minutes. This documentary exposes the role of the South African police and hit squads in apartheid violence and government funding for pro-government vigilante groups. Contains graphic footage of violence in South Africa. Based on footage from "A Savage War of Peace" by Video News Service in South Africa. \$20.00.

HLANGANANI: A SHORT HISTORY OF COSATU (Video News Service — South Africa, 1992) video — 30 minutes. A powerful documentary about the one million member trade union federation COSATU and the major campaigns it has undertaken. \$20.00.

THE TAMBOVILLE INVASION (Wattville Concerned Residents Association, 1992) video — 40 minutes. Faced with one of the most densely populated Black townships in South Africa, the Wattville Concerned Residents Association organized a move of hundreds of families onto a piece of unoccupied "white" land. This video documents the move and the establishment of a new squatter area that is developing into a functional community and the important role played by the civic movement in South Africa. \$20.00.

APARTHEID HAS NOT ENDED: THE ANTI-APARTHEID WITNESS OF FATHER MICHAEL LAPSLEY (Inter-Church Coalition on Africa, 1992) video — 26 minutes. In April 1990, Father Lapsley, an Anglican priest and prominent anti-apartheid activist, received a parcel bomb planted in a religious magazine. He lost both hands and an eye in the blast. This video highlights a personal story of government-sponsored violence and continuing faith witness for justice in southern Africa. \$20.00.

A.F.R.I.C.A. by Stetsasonic featuring Rev. Jesse Jackson and Olatunji (Tommy Boy Music, 1987) video — 4.24 minutes. Produced by the famed rap group Stetsasonic to protest U.S. support for South Africa's war against the Frontline States. \$8.00.

SUN CITY by Artists United Against Apartheid (AUSA/Africa Fund, 1985) video — 45 minutes. A powerful musical statement by fifty popular artists including Little Steven, George Clinton and Bruce Springsteen. \$16.95.

NELSON MANDELA: FREE AT LAST (South Africa Now, 1990) video — 79 minutes. An in-depth news special aired over PBS. Includes the complete speech Mandela gave in Cape Town on the day of his release and interviews with other anti-apartheid leaders. \$75.00.

MANDELA IN AMERICA (Globalvision, 1990) video — 90 minutes. This video documents Mandela's June 1990 visit to the U.S. Includes interviews with Nelson Mandela and the highlights of public events and private moments as well as comments by many who met him. \$75.00.

THE BEST OF SOUTH AFRICA NOW (Globalvision, 1991) video — 60 minutes. Highlights from the three year run of the Emmy Award winning television news magazine *South Africa Now* produced by Globalvision in association with The Africa Fund. \$75.00.

Human Rights

The Africa Fund campaigns for human rights, the release of political prisoners and democracy. The Fund initiated the Unlock Apartheid's Jails campaign and is in regular contact with human rights organizations in South Africa and distributes their materials in the U.S. For more information contact Adotei Akwei.

STOP Apartheid's Violence

More than 11,000 people have been killed in apartheid violence in South Africa, half since the release of Nelson Mandela from prison in 1990. This violence threatens the negotiations to end apartheid. The Fund has sent assistance to the victims of violence and their families. For more information contact Dumisani Kumalo.

Labor Desk

The Africa Fund's Labor Desk supports unions in South Africa and helps establish union to union links between South African and U.S. unions. The Fund has toured South African unionists in the United States including those in dispute with U.S. companies. For more information contact Mike Fleshman.

Civic Campaign

In South Africa in the 1980s Blacks struggling against apartheid started setting up civic organizations in Black townships. Many of these organizations have grown strong, demanding democratic government at the local level as well as fighting for improved services. The Fund has provided assistance to civics including money for a community center. For more information contact Jim Cason.

Economic Links

The Fund monitors U.S. economic links to Africa including debt, trade and aid. The Fund maintains a comprehensive list of U.S. companies doing business in South Africa. For more information contact Richard Knight.

Drought

Drought has devastated agriculture throughout southern Africa and is threatening the lives of millions. The Fund has supported relief programs in Mozambique and distributed educational material in the U.S. For more information contact Jim Cason.
