Mzwanele Mayekiso, Organizing Officer of the Alexandra Civic Organization will speak on the current situation in South Africa.

Alexandra is one of the oldest, poorest black townships in South Africa, with 350,000 residents crammed into its overcrowded and unpaved streets. The community's resistance to apartheid and the development of mass alternative democratic organizations have long made it a target of brutal government repression.

Mzwanele is the brother of Union leader Moses Mayekiso and was a co-accused in the Mayekiso trial in which the Mayekisos were charged with treason and subversion for their community and Union organizing work. In 1989 they were acquitted after spending three years in prison. Their release was a result of massive campaigns in South Africa and in the international labor community in which many Illinois unions participated.
