

FROM THE BOSTON PAN-AFRICAN FORUM

The Boston Pan-African Forum is proud to host **Segi Stefanos** as the guest speaker at our meeting on March 3, 1999. She is presently Assistant Professor in Education, Women's Studies, and Cultural Studies at the University of Massachusetts, Boston. She teaches courses on education and development, gender, class, national politics, race, ethnicity, and culture. Her research interests include Third World societies' education with a focus on Africa and women's issues. For tonight's meeting, she will talk about the war between Ethiopia and Eritrea, how it is portrayed in the popular media, and what the underlying factors are of the war.

Segi earned her master's degree and doctorate at the Harvard School of Education. She has served as a lecturer at Northeastern University and at Smith College. She was a core consultant on the Africa Voices Project at the Smithsonian Institute, which was composed of individuals from academic, cultural, and educational communities for the design of a new Hall of African History and Cultures at the Smithsonian Institute. She served as a co-developer for the South African Association for Literacy and Adult Education Project at UMass-Boston, she is an editorial board member of the Radical Teacher Journal, and she was a Commonwealth Fellow at the Roxbury Multi-Service Center.

This promises to be an educational evening, so make sure you do not miss it. The meeting will be held from 6:30PM to 8:30PM on Wednesday, March 3, 1999, at MIT, 30 Wadsworth Street on the 4th floor in the Milikan Room. Wadsworth Street runs between Main Street and Memorial Drive (there is a BankBoston on the corner at Main Street, and the Sloan School is on the corner of Memorial Drive). Parking is available, which you may enter from Main Street a few yards past Wadsworth going toward Boston. By public transportation, take the Red Line "T" to Kendall Square and walk to the corner of Main Street and Wadsworth.
