Each year during Brotherhood Week, the National Conference of Christians and Jews honors persons contributing to brotherhood. This year the New Jersey N.C.C.J. is honoring Charles W. Engelhard.

Engelhard is the single most influential American investor in the South African economy *** He directly controls 15% of gold production and 20% of uranium production *** In his mines, an African earns 70 cents a day, a white man \$7.82 a day *** After the Sharpeville Massacre in 1960 when overseas investors were deserting South Africa, Engelhard arranged a \$30 million loan in the US, thus averting a major financial crisis *** "You gauge your investments by your risks," said Engelhard recently, "I'd say you were not doing badly if you doubled your money in a few years."

It is shameful that such a man should be recognized for his service to the brotherhood of man.
