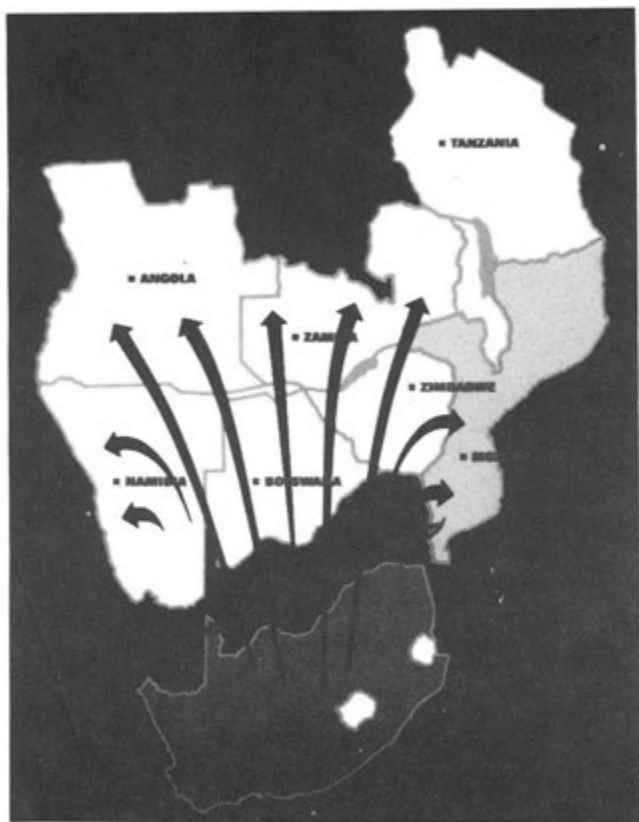

HOW DO WE REACH young people with information about Southern Africa? How do we get them to care?

Teachers, religious groups and other concerned people have been asking that question. Especially now that South Africa's press ban has blocked TV coverage.

A.F.R.I.C.A. is a powerful 5 minute **record** and **video** by the famed rap group Stetsasonic. It also features Nigerian musician Olatunji and the Drums of Passion as well as the Rev. Jesse Jackson. The **A.F.R.I.C.A. Teaching Guide** combines the record and video into a dynamic teaching tool. The Teaching Guide provides background information, a sample lesson and a list of further resources:

A.F.R.I.C.A. is about apartheid **South Africa's** wars against the **Frontline States: Angola, Botswana, Mozambique, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe**. South Africa sees these black ruled countries, which have only recently gained their independence, as a threat to white minority rule in South Africa. As a result, the apartheid government has sought to undermine the governments of these countries, including by force of arms. It is also about South Africa's occupation of neighboring **Namibia**.
