DELAWAREANS CALL FOR ABOLITION OF APARTHEID
- NOT HALF-WAY MEASURES - AT SEPT. 18 RALLY

Delaware religious, labor and civic leaders will speak out for the abolition of Apartheid and a total reversal of the continuing U.S. stance of "constructive engagement" with the racist South Africa regime at a Witness and Rally for a Free South Africa to be held Wednesday, September 18, 4:30-6:30 PM at Rodney Square, Wilmington. The general public is urged to turn out for the Sept. 18 Witness and Rally, organized by the Delaware Committee for a Free South Africa. The Delaware Committee has invited local political officials to participate in the event.

The keynote speaker will be Jerry Herman, a leading organizer of the national anti-apartheid/Free South Africa movement and a recent visitor to Southern Africa. Herman stated that he will point out at the rally that "recent changes in policy by the Reagan Administration and Botha regime are merely political maneuvers attempting to deflect growing pressure within South Africa and around the world for the total dismantling of apartheid and the institution of full political and human rights for all South Africans." Herman will emphasize, "Apartheid can not be reformed - it must be totally dismantled!" Herman will also discuss the aggressive role of the current South African regime in the region of Southern Africa and its alliance with special U.S. interests in the region.

The Delaware Committee for a Free South Africa was formed in May, 1985 by the organizers of the "Conference on South Africa" held in Wilmington on March 30, 1985.
