

CISSAL PLANS:

Activities Against South African Apartheid

The Coalition in Solidarity with Southern African Liberation (CISSAL) is holding a number of political and educational events on all Rutgers University campuses during the week of December 5-9. We call on you to join us. The major thrust of this activity is to raise again the demand that Rutgers University divest itself of all stock in corporations that are involved in the Republic of South Africa. And during this week of activity we hope to raise this demand more powerfully than ever before. The activities we have planned for the days prior to and during the week of Dec. 5-9 include:

****DIVESTITURE PETITION CAMPAIGN**** Sign our petition calling on Rutgers to divest, take copies and circulate them among friends, dorm residents, in organizations that you belong to. Petitions are available at CISSAL literature tables, which are running every day between (at least) 11 AM and 1 PM at the Rutgers Commons, Livingston Great Hall, the Douglass-Cook Student Center.

****FORUM ON SOUTH AFRICA WITH PRESENTATIONS BY EXILED SOUTH AFRICANS**** To be held Monday evening, December 5 at Rutgers College. This is the opening event for the week. Major speakers will be Maphiri Moema, a founder of the South African Students Organization and a member of Black Allied Workers (both recently banned by the apartheid regime), and Andrew Lukele, a well-known author and militant in the South African struggle (and former Livingston College faculty member).

****RALLIES AND PICKET LINES ON ALL CAMPUSES CALLING FOR DIVESTITURE**** To be held at the Douglass-Cook Student Center on Tues., Dec. 6; at the Livingston Great Hall on Wed., Dec. 7; and at the Rutgers Commons on Thurs., Dec. 8--all starting about noon.

****CLOTHING DRIVE FOR ZIMBABWE**** We are now beginning to collect clothes to send to the African people of Zimbabwe. The clothing drop, and more information on this drive, is at the CISSAL literature tables.

In addition there will be in depth small group educationals on each campus during the week, a radio program on WRSU on Tues., Dec. 6, at 8:30 on "Apartheid and Women in South Africa", and a delegation to the Board of Governors meeting on Dec. 9.
